### **Phonics**

Reception use the Read Write Inc scheme to teach phonics:

- Children will bring home picture story books until they are able to blend independently.
- Once children are on red reading books, children will bring home 2 books.
  These will be changed regularly when the books in the sessions change.
- ▶ Please read every night, Talk about the characters, setting and story progression.
- ▶ Please sign the reading record each time you read and record how they have got on. Let us know if there are any sound
- Reading will be regularly monitored by Teachers and TAs



- An online system which records your child's learning in the Early Years.
- Photos, videos and diary entries are shared with parents.
- ► Parents are able to share special moments with staff. This joint approach ensures a permanent record of each child's unique story and memories of their time in Reception.

# What can you do?

- Encourage reading and a love of reading.
- Talk 'Growth Mind-set' positivity!
- Be positive about making mistakes these help us to learn.
- Encourage children to challenge themselves.
- Encourage independence in personal tasks. Build fine motor skills though games, such as playdough, using tongs and threading.
